Magnificent Acreage offers a Slice of Paradise

As far as quintessential Norfolk Island rural blocks go, this 5-acre portion is a standout - with mostly flat and very arable land, the portion looks to the North-West and captures all day sunlight with spectacular sunsets across the valley to ocean. Just a stone's throw from Hundred Acres Reserve, most of the blocks in the area are characterised by fertile livestock, pasture or crop cultivation, and large areas between neighbouring homes.

With dual road frontage, the property can be accessed either from Captain Quintal Drive or New Farm Road, with gated access already in place from the latter.

Hundred Acres Reserve and the surrounding area are home to abundant native wildlife and the iconic Morton Bay Figs lining New Farm Road are just around the corner.
